## A Rare First Edition, The Life of Isaac Mason as a Slave, Is Now at Miller Library from Mary Alice Ball

"Because of the Women's League generous support we were able to acquire (using roughly a quarter of your donation) the rare first edition of *The Life of Isaac Mason as a Slave*. Some of you may have heard of Isaac Mason, Kent County native, because of the Chesapeake Heartland project. You may have even seen the play, Isaac: A Musical Journey. Mason escaped slavery and settled in Worcester, Massachusetts, later self-publishing this autobiography in 1893.

I should add, since I already heard from one of you, that the book, *The Life of Isaac Mason as a Slave*, was digitized and is available on the Internet Archive at: <a href="https://archive.org/details/lifeofisaacmason00maso/mode/2up">https://archive.org/details/lifeofisaacmason00maso/mode/2up</a> if any of you would like to look at it. Two miracles of modern technology! First, that we became of aware of the first edition's sale so quickly, and second, that a digital copy is freely available on the Internet.

I will always be grateful for your collective and individual donations to Miller Library, but no more so than yesterday when we were able to respond within hours and bring this unique title home to Kent County. Please share my thank you with the rest of your members. And, I would be remiss if I didn't remind you that year-end charitable gifts to Library and Academic Technology are always welcome."
